To access online training, a leader must establish a My.Scouting account. This online tool provides leaders with training updates, training links, and much more. Some of this training may also be offered in your district in a face-to-face course.

- Go to https://my.scouting.org
- Click on "Create an account"
- Enter the required information
- Create username, password, and answer security questions.
- Take the Youth Protection Training and print out your completion certificate to complete your BSA registration.

Youth protection training is designed to help you keep our youth safe from abuse. You will learn the Boy Scouts of America's Youth Protection Guidelines, signs of abuse, and how to report suspected abuse. After the completion of three modules, you will complete a test.

Take Position-Specific Training

 A cornerstone of the Scouting program is training. Some of the training will be conducted in the council or your district; some are available for you to work on by yourself. The Boy Scouts of America has designed a program to train leaders in a variety of positions. You can access this training through the BSA Learn Center, available in your My.Scouting account.
