

THE PROGRAMS OF SCOUTING



TIGER CUBS:

First grade boys participate with an adult. Emphasis on family skills, service to others and feelings of self-worth.

CUB SCOUTS:

Second - fifth grade boys, A family and neighborhood centered program with emphasis on social skills and family relationships.



BOY SCOUTS:

Serves boys 11-18 with high adventure, hiking, camping, canoeing, merit badge advancement and leadership opportunities.



Targeted to boys and girls 14-20 offering leadership and high adventure opportunities to senior youth groups.





EXPLORING:


Co-ed vocational program that gives teens 14-20 access to hands-on career education experiences and activities.

LEARNING FOR LIFE:

An inter-curricular and in-school program for boys and girls grades K-12 that offers education, character education, ethical decision making, and living skills.



- ◆ 42,021 young men and women participated in the programs of the South Florida Council.
 - ★ **7.125** Cub Scouts
 - **★ 5,079** Boy Scouts
 - ★ 951 Venturers
 - ★ 2,087 Explorers
 - ★ 26,779 Learning for Life Participants
- Special Programs like our Multi-Cultural Initiatives gave over 2,000 youth from at-risk neighborhoods the opportunity to participate in the programs of Scouting.







- ◆ Over **620** collaborative partners supported the South Florida Council.
- ◆ 218 young men attained Scouting's highest rank the coveted Eagle Scout Award.
- ◆ Over **52,000** community service hours were conducted through just the Eagle Scout projects alone, helping make our communities a better place.
