

- The Great Smoky Mountain Council is responsible for ensuring the success of Scouting programs in 21 East Tennessee counties.
- The Council serves 11,210 registered youth in Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Venturing and Exploring programs. This is a 2% increase over 2009.
- For the fourth year in a row, the Council was awarded the Quality Council Award by the Boy Scouts of America. Councils must achieve high benchmarks for quality program and growth to qualify. Less than 20% of the Councils nationwide achieve this award.
- ◆ 414 Packs, Troops, Posts and Crews were chartered to community organizations, churches and civic clubs at the end of 2010.
- Over 10,000 Scouts, leaders and parents participated in programs at Camp Buck Toms and Camp Pellissippi in 2010.

1,728 Boy Scouts rank advancements and 6,425 Cub Scouts rank advancements were earned during the year.


