A Scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent.





4,368 Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Venturers, and Explorers were served in our council last year.





54% - Camping & Activities


