- 317** Webelos earned the prestigious Arrow of Light.

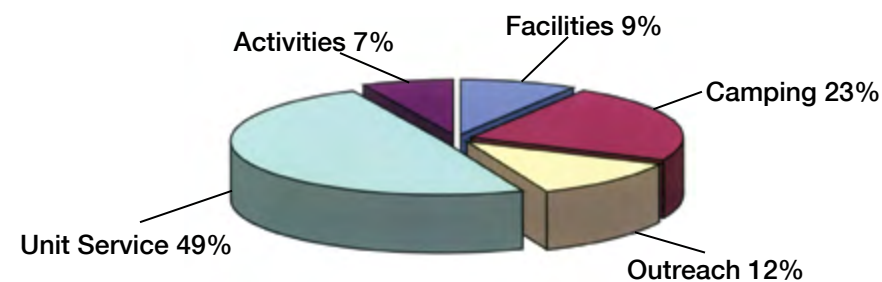
CAMPING
