Seven to ten-year-old girls, boys and their families. A neighborhood centered program with emphasis on social skills and family relationships.



SCOUTS BSA:

Eleven to seventeen-year-old girls, boys and their families. Outdoor activities with emphasis on character, citizenship and leadership training.



VENTURING:

Girls and boys fourteen to twenty-years-old. Offering leadership and high adventure opportunities.



EXPLORING:

Vocational program that gives fourteen to twenty-year-old's access to hands-on career education experiences and activities.

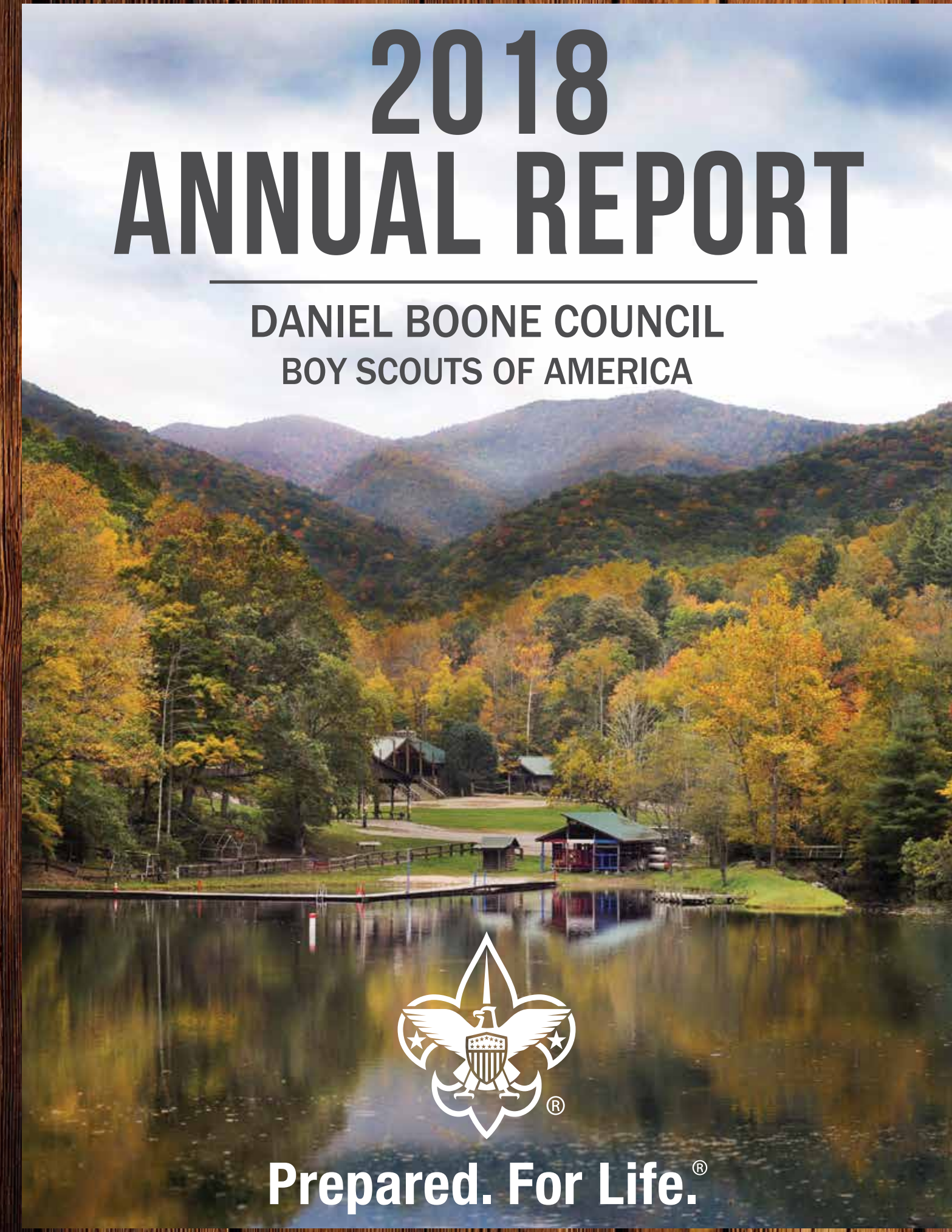

MEMBERSHIP:

Over 4,000 young women and men participated in the programs of the Daniel Boone Council. This year, our National Council changed our membership policy to include female participants in the Cub Scout and Scouts BSA programs.

-  Explorers: **78** young women and men











SERVING OTHERS:

Since 1920, over 4,090 young men in Western North Carolina have earned the rank of Eagle Scout. Through their Eagle Scout service projects, thousands of community service hours have been conducted to benefit our communities. In addition, other Scouts from our Packs, Troops and Crews also perform thousands of additional service hours on an annual basis.

CAMP DANIEL BOONE:

Daniel Boone Council maintains the premiere camping facility in the country, Camp Daniel Boone. Scouts indicate that summer camp is more than just a place to have fun. It also offers Scouts the opportunity to participate in physically and intellectually challenging activities, introduces them to new and rewarding experiences and provides them with supportive and caring relationships.
